Anzac Day is an important date for all Australians, and we gathered in our school theatre to remember those who have served to defend Australia. We do this because it is the anniversary of the day when Australian and New Zealand soldiers landed on the beach at Gallipoli in Türkiye on 25 April 1915. This was the first major military campaign for soldiers from Australia and New Zealand. Since then, 25 April has been known as Anzac Day. 'Anzac' comes from the name Australian and New Zealand Army Corps. It was shortened to ANZAC in 1915. Since then, when Australians and New Zealanders have served together, they have often been known as Anzacs. Our school captains Annie and Sam ran the Assembly with Elouise Pye reading Lest we Forget. It was wonderful to see a large turnout at Heywood Anzac March with several of our students and families marching. As a school we were proud to see a previous student from HDSC, Emily Gorey, address the gathering with an interesting and heartfelt speech about her Great Uncle who was a soldier at Gallipoli.


